- 1) Catechism lead by the PMT: Victor Winter, David Dyck, Mike Williamson Are you interested in knowing what baptism is all about; what it means to be a follower of Jesus and why all this is a life-changing decision? We are beginning another catechism class where we explain the heart of the Christian faith and how you can personally respond to Jesus' invitation. Classes will meet at 8:00am Sunday morning.
- 2) Reconciliation: Conflict Transformation for Ordinary Christians Teachers - Joel Warkentin, Randy Lepp, Location - Board Room What if reconciliation is central to the biblical message? How does this awareness affect our relationships with our family, friends, and neighbours? How does it transform our approach to conflict with coworkers and brothers and sisters in the Church? How does it refocus our solutions to the resolution of global conflicts? Does this alter our view of God? In a discussion format, this class will explore the biblical basis for reconciliation and begin to equip ourselves with tools for better understanding the conflicts in our lives.
- 3) Walking Together in the Word: Reading the Bible as Anabaptists Teachers: Mike Williamson, Janice Huntingford Wagner - Sr.Singing Rm In this class we will read the Bible together using our weekly scripture readings in the NIV Student Bible as our guide.
- 4) Going on Vocation: Exploring work as it was meant to be. Teacher: Mike Groh, Location: Choir Room

This class will look at work from a Christian perspective and how we need to incorporate our faith into what we do for the rest of the week. Simply put: taking Sunday into Monday. Special New Year's Opportunity at LUMC with Dr. Derek Suderman

In our Season of Reading this year we have encountered many scripture texts that challenge our interpretation and understanding. How do we read the Bible today? How do interpret the Bible? How do we apply the Bible to our lives and our world? On January 17 we have invited an outstanding Bible scholar who will help us with these questions. **Dr. Derek Suderman** is professor of Religious Studies at the University of Waterloo (Grebel) and has a wealth of experience interpreting the Old Testament. He will be with us for both our morning worship service, our Education Hour and an afternoon workshop beginning at 3 pm. Save the date!

Sermon: The Beginning of Scripture

Sunday School: The Old Testament: Why Bother?

Have you embarked on reading the Bible with good intentions, only to find that it hasn't lived up to your expectations? Do you feel bogged down in endless laws and stories of failure? Drawing on Jacob's wrestling at the Jabok river as an analogy, we will reflect on what we bring to and expect out of Bible study. What is the point of all this anyway?

Afternoon Bible Study: *More than a 'Fish Story': Jonah's Challenge for Today* Have you ever wondered how Jonah survived in the belly of the fish? While we all know this aspect of the story, we often miss the larger message that stretches beyond this immediate connection. As Jonah preaches to Nineveh, their unexpected response forces Jonah (and us!) to face a dramatic question: what do we expect of God and our enemies? Come, explore Jonah's challenging and timely message in this dynamic, interactive workshop.

Wrestling with Scripture: The Art of Facilitating Dynamic Bible Study (geared especially for Sunday School teachers, Bible study and youth leaders) Are you tired of Bible studies where the leader lectures you to think like him/her, or where everyone shares their opinions but no one seems to learn anything new? Are you concerned about a decline in biblical literacy or have you given up on Bible study altogether? Come, learn some tips for leading Bible studies that avoid these familiar ruts, shifting away from a focus on biblical literacy to ongoing biblical engagement.

Derek Suderman has taught Old Testament at Conrad Grebel and the University of Waterloo (Waterloo, Canada) since 2006. He represents Mennonite Church Canada on the Editorial Council of the Believer's Church Bible Commentary series. Derek is married to author and educator Rebecca Seiling, with whom he has two daughters, Zoe and Eden.
