Refugee Family Update ... We are very excited about our family's arrival. They are arriving in Windsor late Monday night. The home in Kingsville is ready and preparations have been made to make sure there will be food to welcome them. The father is Mohammed Taher Albek (1980) and the mom is Bushra Ashtar (1983). The son's name is Osama Albek (2005) and the daughter's name is Hasna Albek (2010). The first few weeks will be busy with getting the family registered with the government, getting them to doctor's appointments and getting them language assessments and registered for language classes and school. An Arabic interpreter, through SECC, has been arranged to be at the airport when they arrive. Please pray for this family and the committee as they work together to settle this family. If you can, please help by donating money to our Refugee Fund or help with gift cards. Because they will be living in Kingsville they will probably use Freshco grocery cards and Walmart gift cards.
