Sunday School Curriculum - In our Sunday School we use the curriculum Shine: Living in God's Light. Children and teachers form a worshiping and learning community where kindness can grow. The major goals of this curriculum are to nurture children and youth in their faith formation and to explore what it means to follow in the footstep of Jesus in Christian community. Children learn that they are known and loved by God, that God is with them in the midst of exuberant play, settling arguments, mealtimes and conversation, and they learn that they can help shine Christ's love to the world in their everyday lives.

Together, young and old can shine the light of Christ in the world around us.

1) The Challenge of Parenting

Teacher - Victor Winter Location - Board Room

Is there any of our life-tasks that is more challenging and more rewarding than being parents to our children? In this course we want to share our wisdom as we come together to talk about our parenting roles. We will use Dr. Gordon Neufeld's *Hold on to your Kids* as a resource. All parents are welcome! It promises to be a lively class.

2) Walking Together in the Word: Reading the Bible as Anabaptists

Teachers: David Dyck and Mike Williamson, Location - Sr. Singing Room In this class we will read the Bible together using our weekly scripture readings in the NIV Student Bible as our guide. The following questions will guide our discussion and application of the Biblical text.

- How does this text help us to follow the great commandment of Jesus: *to love God and to love each other?*
- What did this story mean to God's people when it was first written? What does it mean to them today?
- How might an Anabaptist reading of this text be different from other Christians?
- How does this text fit into the big story of God's work, saving the world and making all things new?
- How does this passage whisper the name of Jesus? How does it anticipate his coming and his mission in the world?
- What does this passage reveal to us about God; about ourselves; about sin and about salvation?
- What don't we understand about this story text? What questions are left unanswered?

3) Biblical Mythbusters: Everything Happens for a Reason

Teacher: Rudy Dyck Location - Choir Room

This is something many people say. But how true is it? What are the good and bad consequences or implications of it? We'll discuss some of the scriptures surrounding this idea as well openly discuss our own personal stories and beliefs.

Youth Class: Echo the Story - GenesisTeacher - Mike Williamson
From creation to the formation of the church, students will experience the biblical narrative through storytelling, creative reflection, and dialogue. The first six weeks we will explore the story of God and his people in the book of Genesis.
