## Welcome to Dr. Timothy Geddert

Our guest speaker today comes from the sunny central valley of California. Throughout his career Dr. Geddert has served as a church planter, a pastor, a Bible school teacher and a seminary professor. He is currently professor of New Testament at Fresno Pacific University and the author of numerous articles and books. Two of his books are in our library; a Believers Church Bible Commentary on the gospel of Mark and a book on Christian ethics entitled 'All Right Now', both published by Herald Press. We have a number of copies of his book on ethics that will be for sale over the weekend. Here is his own description of his vocation: "Followers of Jesus who are training to provide leadership for God's people must be life-long learners for whom Scripture is an inexhaustible source of challenge and inspiration. That happens best as we learn methods of biblical interpretation (and the original language of Scripture if possible). It also requires a sense of adventure, openness to new insights, and an eagerness to test ideas within the community of faith. It is my special privilege and calling to help students acquire these abilities and attitudes."


Youth
