On the last Sunday of 2017, I delivered a sermon in which I tried to both look back and look ahead. In December we enjoyed some wonderful Advent and Christmas services, and yet some of us have suffered deep losses this past year, some of us have had a hard time joining in the celebrations. And so, our service included a "Blue" Christmas element on December 31. But. looking ahead, my primary text that morning was the words of Jesus in Luke 21:25-31, where Jesus cryptically speaks about the future. How can we understand his words?

Here at the beginning of a new year, it's an attitude we always want to keep: glancing back to the past, always making adjustments...but always looking ahead with expectation and planfulness and faith.

What lies ahead for LUMC in 2018? Here are a few thoughts:

The Triumph of the Lamb: Reading the Book of Revelation Responsibly

Many regard Revelation as the hardest book in the New Testament. It is full of strange, lurid, and sometimes bizarre and violent imagery. As a result, people who are quite at home in the Gospels, Acts, and Paul find themselves tiptoeing around Revelation with a sense that they don't really belong there. But they do! The book of Revelation offers one of the clearest and sharpest visions of God's ultimate purpose for the whole creation. Here we see how the powerful forces of evil can be and are being overthrown through the victory of Jesus the Messiah and the consequent costly victory of the his followers.

This class is for those who are confused by, afraid of and or / preoccupied with the book of Revelation. Each weekly class will seek to rescue the book Revelation from harmful readings, restoring it as a source of hope as we navigate today's troubled world, encouraging us to trust the way of the lamb.

Saints and Sinners – Lost and Found – The Stories of our Lives
