### 90th Anniversary Feature: What's in a Name?

LUMC has had several names in its history....but the very first name? *The Mennonite Refugee Church*. A bit later it was called Essex County Mennonite Church...then later the adjective "United" was added...and finally it was changed to "Leamington," resulting in our present name.

But it's most interesting that the first descriptors in our name were "Mennonite" and "Refugee". Our founding families were Mennonite refugees. We continue to be part of a Mennonite conference of churches; and we have continued to welcome a variety of people looking for a home, a church, a community.

I think maybe as a church we've been at our best when we've been open to welcoming the stranger. That hasn't always been possible (more on that next time) and sometimes we've looked inwards more. But it poses an interesting question: over 90 years, who are the people who we've welcomed to join us at LUMC?

In our early years, as I detailed last month, our founders were Russian Mennonite refugees.

Our next major influx came after World War 2. Mennonites who had suffered through Stalin's efforts to complete the communist revolution and the horrors of WW2, came in large numbers. These refugees came from Russia, Germany, Poland, Paraguay and other places.

Starting in the 50s and 60s...other Mennonite "cousins" starting coming into this area.... they were descendants of an even earlier exodus from Russia.

#### Book Review submitted by Andrea Warkentin: Under the Overpass by Mike Yankoski

Have you ever wondered what it would be like to live on the streets? Could you survive? Would your faith in God hold up? These questions and more plagued a young college man named, Mike Yankoski. After much thought, prayer and discussion with people he trusted, Mike and his friend, Sam decided to embark on an almost six-month journey where they lived on the streets of six different U.S.A. cities. This book is full of Mike and Sam's stories about the trials and triumphs of the months they spent on the street. Their stories are from the heart and show everything from dismay and frustration to hope and faith. Find out how these two young men stay true to their faith by finding God in the places and the people you would least expect.

I highly recommend this book. It is a heartfelt and inspirational story. Despite the topic, it's an easy and enjoyable read. The book moves quickly. The stories are deep and tug at the heart strings, but Mike Yankoski has a way of writing them with an edge of humour as well. It's hard to put down once you start.

In the1870s they had moved largely to western Canada and US....but some of them, when once again feeling the pressure of governments, went on to Mexico, Central America and South America. More conservative, they now came north with their large families, looking for new opportunities. Some of those joined us too.

And then, adding more new names... How? Through marriages. Our people met and married people with last names like Pezzotti, Dietz, Buckrell, Chacko and Burgess.

And then....people came to visit for a variety of reasons, and for a variety of reasons felt at home....and stayed! Names like Andrew, Hawkins, Sellick, Charbonneau, Cha and Taggart come to mind.

And, we continue to welcome new members who join us for a wide variety of reasons.

I'm struck that the descriptor "United" still seems to make lot of sense! This congregation has experienced a lot of change over the years, especially as it has welcomed and integrated new members and participants. I'll say more about other changes in next month's article.

And remember! We'll celebrate those 90 years of changes in our June 16 Service of Celebration. Note that Sunday on your calendar!



Please bring the bags back to the lobby at the end of the service.


### Sower and the Seed Crossword
